- 10. **HB 106 Eminent domain- wind energy collector systems (Veto Override).** This bill would have extended an existing moratorium on the exercise of eminent domain authority for purposes of wind energy projects until June 2032, protecting private property rights and Wyoming's extractive industries from government-funded competition. This bill passed both the House and the Senate,



but was vetoed by Governor Gordon. Many legislators showed their allegiance to the Governor when voting to override his veto. This bill supports Wyoming Republican Party Platform Plank #5, which opposes the use of eminent domain.
