
Sen. Ogden Driskill

Since the start of the Legislative Session, Senator Driskill voted against a bill that would have banned foreign adversaries like the Chinese Communist Party from owning Wyoming agricultural land (House Joint Resolution 2). He also voted against a bill to help our state partner with President Trump's common sense agenda to deport criminal illegal immigrants (Senate File 124). He voted against property tax reform (House Bill 282), a bill to stop local governments from violating your constitutional rights (Senate File 85), and a bill to protect

Wyoming from environmentalist land grabs (House Bill 93).
