WyoRINO SENATE BILL DESCRIPTIONS 2025

1. SF0001S2016. Budget Amendment Spending \$4 Million on Taxpayer Funded Party & Air Race.

This amendment would have added an additional \$4 million of spending to the budget bill for party planning and for economic development in the event that a Wyoming community is selected as the site for an unknown future national championship air race.

This unnecessary spending item violates WRP Platform #17, which states that “All taxes collected must be used for the constitutional purposes of government. It is irresponsible to run up debts that are passed on to our children and grandchildren.” **We have assigned an AYE to the NAY votes.** <https://wyoleg.gov/2025/Amends/SF0001S2016.pdf>

2. SF0001S2012. Budget Amendment Adding 14 Full Time Employees to Department of Health

This amendment to the budget bill would have added 14 full time employees to the Department of Health, an agency that has historically operated with dozens of vacant positions and no urgency to fill them.

This unnecessary spending item violates WRP Platform #17, which states that “All taxes collected must be used for the constitutional purposes of government. It is irresponsible to run up debts that are passed on to our children and grandchildren.” **We have assigned an AYE to the NAY votes.** <https://wyoleg.gov/2025/Amends/SF0001S2012.pdf>

3. HB0172. Repeal Gun Free Zones & Preemption Amendments.

This bill repeals all government-mandated gun free zones in Wyoming, allowing Wyoming residents to exercise constitutional and concealed carry in government buildings, at government meetings, and in the People’s House in Cheyenne.

This bill supports WRP Platform Plank #3, which states that “the right of individuals to keep and bear arms and ammunition shall not be infringed, restricted, or denied.” **We have assigned a plus to the AYE votes.** <https://wyoleg.gov/Legislation/2025/HB0172>

4. SF0069. Homeowner Property Tax Exemption

As debated on third reading in the House of Representatives, this bill would have created a 50% property tax exemption for residential property owners for two years and, after the second year, would have continued into perpetuity in the form of a 25% property tax exemption.

This bill supports WRP Resolution Supporting the People’s Initiative to Limit Property Tax in Wyoming adopted at the November 2023 WRP Central Committee meeting. **We have assigned a plus to the AYE**

5. **HB0282. Property Tax Acquisition Value.**

This bill would have changed the way Wyoming taxes property by moving to an acquisition-based property tax system. If passed, this bill would have prevented county assessors from taxing property owners on unrealized gains, as the amount of taxable value would be determined at the time of the purchase. Property taxes in Wyoming have risen to levels never before seen.

This bill supports WRP Platform Plank #17, which states that “Taxes should never be more than necessary to meet the government’s constitutional obligations.” **We have assigned a plus to the AYE votes.** <https://wyoleg.gov/Legislation/2025/HB0282>

6. **HJ0002. Foreign Adversaries- Prohibited Property Ownership.**

This resolution would have proposed an amendment to the Wyoming Constitution prohibiting foreign adversaries like the Chinese Communist Party from owning Wyoming agricultural property.

This bill supports two WRP Resolutions adopted at the 2022 WRP State Convention (Defending Against Hostile Nations & Foreign Government Ownership of Land). **We have assigned a plus to the AYE votes.** <https://wyoleg.gov/Legislation/2025/HJ0002>

7. **SF0085. Constitutional Enforcement of Localities.**

This simple bill would have withheld tax dollars from local governments violating the Wyoming or U.S. Constitutions.

This bill supports WRP Platform Planks #12 and #17, which declare that governments possess powers derived only from the consent of the governed and that taxes must only be used for the constitutional purposes of government. **We have assigned a plus to the AYE votes.** <https://wyoleg.gov/Legislation/2025/SF0085>

8. **SF0127. Administrative Rules- Legislative Review (VETO OVERRIDE)**

This bill limits the ability of state agencies to make administrative rules and subjects major rules to legislative review, restoring the legislative branch of its constitutional power to make laws. Governor Gordon vetoed this bill, and the Legislature voted to override his veto, which required a $\frac{2}{3}$ vote for final passage.

This bill supports WRP Platform Plank #13, which celebrates the construction of the US and Wyoming Constitutions and the separation of powers therein. **We have assigned a plus to the AYE votes.** <https://wyoleg.gov/Legislation/2025/SF0127>

9. **SJ0001. Convention of States.**

This resolution would have requested Congress to call an Article V Convention of States in order to amend the U.S. Constitution.



This resolution violates WRP Resolution against an Article V Convention of States adopted at the 2024 WRP State Convention. **We have assigned a plus to the NAY votes.** <https://wyoleg.gov/Legislation/2025/SJ0001>

10. **SJ0008. Political Expenditures.**

This resolution would have requested that Congress establish limits on campaign spending in an attempt to overturn Citizens United v. FEC (2010).

This bill violates WRP Platform Planks #22 and #23, which recognizes that freedom of speech is a fundamental right secured by the United States Constitution and which opposes any federal regulation of Wyoming elections.
